

Dear Friends in Jesus.

Sunday, May 4, is a day with many meanings this year! First, since it is the first Sunday of the month of May, it should come as no surprise that it will include the opportunity for us to join in celebrating Holy Communion in our morning worship.

May 4 is also the Third Sunday of Easter, or the 15th day of the Easter Season, which means that it is also a day when we continue to remind our hurting world that Easter is much more than a single day of bunnies and eggs, but instead is a 50-day celebration that is all about the cosmos-changing fact that *Christ is Risen - He is Risen Indeed!* But there is more...

Our Lord Jesus, Risen and Conquering on Easter, is ever about making all things new, and we will experience that reality in two very concrete ways on May 4. During our 10:15 A.M. Celebration of Holy Communion, we will, for the very first time, use our new red worship books Evangelical Lutheran Worship. I am very excited about this new beginning in our worship life, and I hope you are as well. And please don't worry about it being unfamiliar. For one thing, we will be using a musical setting of the liturgy that very closely resembles the one we are most familiar with from our green worship books — for another, we will simply take our time and work together to learn and make the new book as familiar and loved as the old one! Please note that May 4 worship will include our next Children's Church, during which our Young Persons Grade 6 and younger will be excused for a special activity time, so this may help the parents among us to focus a bit more on the new page numbers and such! (And, by the way, as you may recall, our green worship books won't simply be disappearing after May 4. We will continue to use them as our outdoor hymnals during the summer and, eventually, for our Sunday School opening time downstairs as well.)

The other manifestation of the newness of Easter on May 4 will be a congregational covered dish dinner following worship. Besides being a great time to enjoy the wonderful mix of dishes and the fellowship that always goes with a congregational meal here at St. John, we will take time to hear about, ask about, and react to the final recommendations of our Prayerful Planning Group (PPG) for our congregational life together over the next five to ten years. As the PPG prepares to move from "planning mode" into "implementation mode", we want to make sure that, as much as possible, we are all on the same page. As you'll hear on May 4, this will by no means be the final time you will be hearing about and reacting to the work of the PPG. There will also be several items which will (eventually) require actual congregational meetings and votes, but that will be for another day, a little further down the road.

Spread the news – *Christ is Risen, He is Risen Indeed* – and He is up to some very exciting and surprising things here at The Hill Church!


