With the May 31 ending of the "official" two years for contributions to be made to our *Restoration 250* project, the final financial numbers are now available. The final total project cost was \$216,795, considerably less than the total project budget of \$220,000. A total of \$139,440 was received in designated giving, which left \$77,355 to be covered by interest monies from our Memorials Fund, considerably less than the \$88,000 which it was originally estimated we would need. The total project came in under budget and we received more giving toward the project than we anticipated such that we were able to save \$10,645 in interest monies! Thank you to all who contributed in any way in planning and/or in financial giving and to overall project coordinator Sandra Lamenza!
